Stay at Home	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Senior citizens and individuals with significant underlying medical conditions are ordered to stay at home and take all measures to limit risk of exposure to COVID-19. All persons in Florida shall “limit movements and personal interactions outside their home” to only those necessary to obtain or provide essential services or conduct essential activities. Business Closures/Restrictions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Order encourages persons to work from home. Encourages all businesses to provide delivery, carry-out or curbside service to the greatest extent practicable. Does not expressly close businesses, but their operations will necessarily be limited because of the limit on the movement of persons, above 	EO 20-91 p. 3 § 2
Local Orders	This Order supersedes any and all conflicting action or order issued by local officials, to the extent that such action or order allows essential services or essential activities prohibited by this Order.	EO 20-91 p. 5 § 4
